## INSTRUCTIONS FOR, PRIVATE WATER WELL REHABILITATION APPLICATION

- 1. FILL OUT THE APPLICATION AS COMPLETELY AS POSSIBLE.
- 2. AN ESTIMATED ITEMIZED BID SHOULD BE OBTAINED FROM A CERTIFIED WELL CONTRACTOR AND SUBMITTED WITH THIS APPLICATION.

According to Chapter 47 of the <u>Code of Iowa</u> the only justification for funding rehabilitation projects is to prevent contamination of the aquifer. Improving the quality of an individual drinking water supply is a very advantageous by-product of the work.

## CRITERIA FOR OUALIFYING A WELL FOR REHABILITATION FUNDING

Well contaminated with nitrate only

Well with lower casing in poor condition	
Well that is rock or brick cased	
Well drawing water from surficial, uncon	fined aquifer
Well constructed after January 1, 1989
