WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JOHNSON COUNTY that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3).

# RESOLUTION SETTING FORTH PROPOSAL FOR TRANSFER OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED ALONG MELROSE AVENUE, IOWA CITY, IOWA AND SETTING PUBLIC HEARING

WHEREAS, Johnson County is a municipal corporation under Iowa Code Chapter 331 and the City of Iowa City, Iowa (herein "City of Iowa City" or "City") is a municipal corporation under Iowa Code Chapter 362; and

WHEREAS, Johnson County owns 0.22 acres of undeveloped real property comprising part of Auditor's Parcel 2003012 as filed in Book 46 Page 38 in the office of the Johnson County Recorder, depicted and more particularly described on that Acquisition Plat attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, as well as 1.14 acres of undeveloped real property located in the NE ¼ of Section 13, Township 79 North, Range 7 West of the 5<sup>th</sup> P.M., Johnson County, Iowa, depicted and more particularly described on that Acquisition Plat attached hereto as **Exhibit B** (herein altogether, the "County Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Johnson County Board of Supervisors (herein "Board") approved on May 5, 2019 and Johnson County and the City of Iowa City thereafter entered into that certain agreement entitled "28E Agreement between Johnson County, Iowa and the City of Iowa City, Iowa for Improvements to Melrose Avenue / F46 (IWV Road) from Highway 218 to Hebl Avenue" (the "28E Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, consulting engineers for the project, Anderson-Bogert Engineers & Surveyors, Inc. (herein "Engineers"), have identified the County Property as needed for additional right-of-way and accommodation of the designed improvements to Melrose Avenue; and

WHEREAS, said Engineers have identified certain tracts designated as Tract 1 and Tract 2 on the exhibit incorporated into that Temporary Construction Easement Agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit C**, as necessary property for facilitating the City's construction of improvements to Melrose Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the portion of Melrose Avenue adjoining the County Property lies within the corporate limits of the City of Iowa City, jurisdiction and control thereof being vested in the city council of said City and therefore, the County Property should be transferred to the City of Iowa City for right-of-way purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Iowa City has requested that the County Property and the temporary construction easement be conveyed to the City for no monetary compensation, as permitted by Iowa Code Section 331.361(4); and

WHEREAS, based upon the mutual consideration set forth in the 28E Agreement, the benefits to be obtained by Johnson County residents arising from road improvements contemplated by the 28E Agreement, and jurisdiction over the applicable roadway segment set by Iowa Code, the Board hereby determines, pursuant to Iowa Code section 331.361, that conveying the County Property to the City of Iowa City, and granting the easement described in the Temporary Construction Easement Agreement,

all in furtherance of the 28E Agreement, is for a public purpose;

WHEREAS, Section 331.361(2) of the 2021 Code of Iowa requires Johnson County, in disposing of an interest in real property, to set forth its proposed plan in a resolution, to publish notice of the time and place of a public hearing on the proposed plan and, after the public hearing, make a final determination on the proposed plan;

# TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT AGREEMENT MELROSE AVENUE/IWV ROAD – HIGHWAY 218 TO HEBL AVENUE – IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between **Johnson County**, **Iowa**, hereinafter "OWNER", and the **City of Iowa City**, **Iowa**, a municipal corporation, hereinafter "CITY."

In consideration of their mutual promises herein, OWNER and CITY agree as follows:

- 1. OWNER states and covenants that it is the owner of certain real estate described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto, by virtue of legal and/or equitable title, that it is lawfully seized and possessed of said real estate, and that it has good and lawful right to convey this easement. OWNER further agrees to indemnify CITY against any and all claims by tenants or others claiming ownership or possessor rights to the property described on Exhibit "A".
- OWNER does hereby grant and convey to CITY a temporary construction easement in, over and across that portion of OWNER's property described and depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto (hereafter "Temporary Easement Area") for the purpose of facilitating CITY's construction of the MELROSE AVENUE/IWV ROAD HIGHWAY 218 TO HEBL AVENUE IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT (public improvement"), which grant to CITY shall include necessary grading, excavation, piling of dirt, regrading, restoration, storage of materials and equipment, and ingress and egress of persons and equipment to the Temporary Easement Area, as needed to complete said public improvement.
- 3. The term of this Temporary Construction Easement will be for the period of time required by CITY to complete the construction of the public improvement, commencing upon initiation of said construction, but in no event, shall the duration of the Temporary Construction Easement extend beyond the date two (2) years after commencement of construction in the Temporary Easement Area. This Temporary Construction Easement

shall expire and be of no further effect in the event the construction of the public improvement is not commenced within five (5) years of the date of OWNER's execution of this agreement.

- 4. With respect to the Temporary Construction Easement, OWNER grants the following rights:
  - a. CITY shall have the right to make excavations within the Temporary Easement Area, and to grade as CITY may find reasonably necessary for the construction. CITY covenants and agrees to protect such excavations during construction; to promptly fill said excavations following construction; and to hold OWNER harmless from third party liability during said construction.
  - b. CITY shall promptly backfill any trench made by it, and repair any damages caused by CITY within the Temporary Easement Area, but excluding the replacement of trees, shrubs and brush on the Easement Area. CITY shall indemnify OWNER against loss or damage which occurs as a result of CITY's negligent acts or omissions in the exercise of its easement rights herein. Once the Temporary Easement Area has been restored substantially to its prior condition and except as expressly provided in this Temporary Easement Agreement, CITY shall have no further responsibility for maintaining the Temporary Easement Area.
  - c. CITY shall have the right of ingress and egress to and from the Temporary Easement Area by such route within the Temporary Easement Area as shall occasion the least practical damage and inconvenience to OWNER.
  - d. CITY shall have the right to trim or remove all structures, trees, brush, and any other landscaping features which may interfere with the exercise of CITY's rights pursuant to this Temporary Easement Agreement.
- 5. CITY covenants and agrees that existing driveways, fences, underground drainage tile or other site features, with the exception of trees, shrubs and brush, which are removed or disturbed shall, to the extent reasonably possible, be replaced by CITY to conform with features or items removed during construction. CITY further agrees that all grassed areas disturbed by the construction shall be seeded within a reasonable time after construction is complete.
- 6. CITY covenants and agrees to remove and stockpile existing topsoil from areas to be excavated, to be used in the event of any repair. Following installation of the public improvement, all areas within the Temporary Easement Area which are disturbed will be graded to form a uniform slope, and topsoil shall be replaced and respread over disturbed areas, thereby restoring said area substantially to its prior condition, with the exception of the replacement of trees, shrubs and brush.

- 7. CITY hereby gives notice of OWNER's five year right to renegotiate construction or maintenance damages not apparent at the time of the signing of this easement agreement as required by §6B.52, Code of Iowa (2021).
- 8. The provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of and bind the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto, shall be deemed a covenant which runs with the land and with the title to the land, and shall be recorded in the Johnson County Recorder's Office, at CITY expense.





## TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT AGREEMENT MELROSE AVENUE/IWV ROAD - HIGHWAY 218 TO HEBL AVENUE -IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between Johnson County, Iowa, hereinafter "OWNER", and the City of Iowa City, Iowa, a municipal corporation, hereinafter "CITY."

In consideration of their mutual promises herein, OWNER and CITY agree as follows:

- OWNER states and covenants that it is the owner of certain real estate described on Exhibit 1. "A" attached hereto, by virtue of legal and/or equitable title, that it is lawfully seized and possessed of said real estate, and that it has good and lawful right to convey this easement. OWNER further agrees to indemnify CITY against any and all claims by tenants or others claiming ownership or possessor rights to the property described on Exhibit "A".
- OWNER does hereby grant and convey to CITY a temporary construction easement in, 2. over and across that portion of OWNER's property described and depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto (hereafter "Temporary Easement Area") for the purpose of facilitating CITY's construction of the MELROSE AVENUE/IWV ROAD - HIGHWAY 218 TO HEBL AVENUE - IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT (public improvement"), which grant to CITY shall include necessary grading, excavation, piling of dirt, regrading, restoration, storage of materials and equipment, and ingress and egress of persons and equipment to the Temporary Easement Area, as needed to complete said public improvement.
- The term of this Temporary Construction Easement will be for the period of time required 3. by CITY to complete the construction of the public improvement, commencing upon initiation of said construction, but in no event, shall the duration of the Temporary Construction Easement extend beyond the date two (2) years after commencement of

construction in the Temporary Easement Area. This Temporary Construction Easement shall expire and be of no further effect in the event the construction of the public improvement is not commenced within five (5) years of the date of OWNER's execution of this agreement.

- 4. With respect to the Temporary Construction Easement, OWNER grants the following rights:
  - a. CITY shall have the right to make excavations within the Temporary Easement Area, and to grade as CITY may find reasonably necessary for the construction. CITY covenants and agrees to protect such excavations during construction; to promptly fill said excavations following construction; and to hold OWNER harmless from third party liability during said construction.
  - b. CITY shall promptly backfill any trench made by it, and repair any damages caused by CITY within the Temporary Easement Area, but excluding the replacement of trees, shrubs and brush on the Easement Area. CITY shall indemnify OWNER against loss or damage which occurs as a result of CITY's negligent acts or omissions in the exercise of its easement rights herein. Once the Temporary Easement Area has been restored substantially to its prior condition and except as expressly provided in this Temporary Easement Agreement, CITY shall have no further responsibility for maintaining the Temporary Easement Area.
  - c. CITY shall have the right of ingress and egress to and from the Temporary Easement Area by such route within the Temporary Easement Area as shall occasion the least practical damage and inconvenience to OWNER.
  - d. CITY shall have the right to trim or remove all structures, trees, brush, and any other landscaping features which may interfere with the exercise of CITY's rights pursuant to this Temporary Easement Agreement.
- 5. CITY covenants and agrees that existing driveways, fences, underground drainage tile or other site features, with the exception of trees, shrubs and brush, which are removed or disturbed shall, to the extent reasonably possible, be replaced by CITY to conform with features or items removed during construction. CITY further agrees that all grassed areas disturbed by the construction shall be seeded within a reasonable time after construction is complete.
- 6. CITY covenants and agrees to remove and stockpile existing topsoil from areas to be excavated, to be used in the event of any repair. Following installation of the public improvement, all areas within the Temporary Easement Area which are disturbed will be graded to form a uniform slope, and topsoil shall be replaced and respread over disturbed

areas, thereby restoring said area substantially to its prior condition, with the exception of the replacement of trees, shrubs and brush.

- 7. CITY hereby gives notice of OWNER's five year right to renegotiate construction or maintenance damages not apparent at the time of the signing of this easement agreement as required by §6B.52, Code of Iowa (2021).
- 8. The provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of and bind the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto, shall be deemed a covenant which runs with the land and with the title to the land, and shall be recorded in the Johnson County Recorder's Office, at CITY expense.



WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Johnson County, Iowa (the "County"), has proposed to enter into a loan agreement (the "Essential County Purposes Loan Agreement") in a principal amount not to exceed \$16,125,800, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 331.402, 331.441 and 331.443 of the Code of Iowa, for the purpose of paying the cost, to that extent, of the Essential County Purposes set out above, and has published notice of the proposed action and has held a hearing thereon on March 16, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Board has also proposed to enter into a loan agreement (the "HHS and Administration Buildings Improvements Loan Agreement") in a principal amount not to exceed \$1,125,000, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 331.402, 331.441 and 331.443 of the Code of Iowa, for the purpose of paying the cost, to that extent, of constructing improvements to the HHS and Administration Buildings and related property, and has published notice of the proposed action and has held a hearing thereon on March 16, 2021, and

WHEREAS, the Board has also proposed to enter into a loan agreement (the "Ambulance Equipment Loan Agreement") in a principal amount not to exceed \$61,200, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 331.402, 331.441 and 331.442 of the Code of Iowa, for the purpose of paying the cost, to that extent, of acquiring equipment for the Ambulance Department, and has published notice of the proposed action and has held a hearing thereon on March 16, 2021, and no petition has been filed asking that the question of entering into the Ambulance Equipment Loan Agreement be submitted to the registered voters of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Board has also proposed to enter into a loan agreement (the "County Vehicles Loan Agreement") in a principal amount not to exceed \$204,800, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 331.402, 331.441 and 331.442 of the Code of Iowa, for the purpose of paying the cost, to that extent, of acquiring vehicles for various County departments, and has published notice of the proposed action and has held a hearing thereon on March 16, 2021, and no petition has been filed asking that the question of entering into the County Vehicles Loan Agreement be submitted to the registered voters of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Essential County Purposes Loan Agreement, the HHS and Administration Buildings and Improvements Loan Agreement, the Courthouse Renovation and Improvements Loan Agreement, the County Building Improvements and Equipment Loan Agreement, the Information Technology Improvements and Equipment Loan Agreement, the Conservation Department Park Facilities Loan Agreement, the Jail Improvements Loan Agreement, the County Sheriff Vehicles Loan Agreement, the Ambulance Vehicle Loan Agreement, the Ambulance Equipment Loan Agreement, and the County Vehicles Loan Agreement are hereinafter referred to collectively as the "2021 Loan Agreement"; and

# RESOLUTION ENDORSING IOWA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION COVID-19 RELIEF RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM GRANT APPLICATION FOR THE JOHNSON COUNTY HISTORIC POOR FARM TRAIL PROJECT

Whereas, it is the mission of the Johnson County Board of Supervisors (hereafter "Board") to enhance the quality of life for residents by providing exceptional public services in a collaborative, responsive, and fiscally accountable manner; and

Whereas, the Johnson County Historic Poor Farm is one of the few extant examples of the county poor farm model established in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century to care for the indigent, disabled, and ill; and

Whereas, through a ten-year master planning process established in 2017, the Board prioritizes the historic preservation and thoughtful evolution of the Johnson County Historic Poor Farm to provide a public recreational and educational space connecting the land and local history through inclusive, community-led opportunities; and

Whereas, the Board has opportunities to apply for various grants from governmental or private parties to and enhance County facilities, public services, and programs; and

Whereas, the Board desires to construct a new trail at the Johnson County Historic Poor Farm, in accordance with the eligible activities of the COVID-19 Relief Recreational Trails Program, to connect this public space to the Iowa City Parks and Trails System while advancing the mission and strategic priorities of the Board and the Iowa Bicycle and Pedestrian Long Range Plan; and

Whereas, the proposed 3.01 mile-long, 10' wide multi-use trail has a total pre-design estimated project cost of \$1,204,000; and

Whereas, the Board desires to seek \$750,000 in COVID-19 Relief Recreational Trails Program funds through the Iowa Department of Transportation to support this project; and

Whereas, the grant application requires that Johnson County provide certain endorsements, including adequate maintenance of the Johnson County Historic Poor Farm Trail for 20 years, and Johnson County's intent to match the project costs at approximately 40% and to provide all project funds not granted by the COVID-19 Relief Recreational Trails Program; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Johnson, Iowa that:

- 1. The above described project is authorized and endorsed.
- 2. The grant application submitted by the Johnson County Board of Supervisors to the Iowa Department of Transportation to seek COVID-19 Recreational Trails Program funding in the amount of \$750,000 is eligible and in alignment with local and state trail plans.
- 3. Johnson County affirms its intention to provide funding for such trail project to support all costs exceeding the COVID-19 Relief Recreational Trails Program award at an approximate match ratio of 40% of the total project cost.
- 4. If such COVID-19 Relief Recreational Trails Program grant is awarded to Johnson County, the County will adequately maintain the Johnson County Historic Poor Farm Trail so that it will be made available for its intended multiuse to members of the public for 20 years from the date of acceptance of such trail project construction.

## RESOLUTION NO. 05-27-21-01

## RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE JOHNSON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH REGULATION RESCINDING FACE COVERING REGULATION

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services declared a national public health emergency related to the dangers posed by COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States signed an emergency disaster declaration under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act authorizing emergency response measures in all fifty states in response to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the Governor of Iowa issued a Proclamation of Public Health Disaster Emergency after multiple cases of COVID-19 had been confirmed in Iowa and the Iowa Department of Public Health determined that community spread was occurring within the state; and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 135.140 defines a public health disaster as a disaster which specifically involves an imminent threat of an illness that poses a high probability of widespread exposure to an infectious agent that poses a significant risk of future harm to a large number of the affected population; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Health enacted and the Board of Supervisors approved Johnson County Resolution 08-06-20-02 effective August 10, 2020, a regulation mandating face coverings due to significant community spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, all available information indicates that COVID-19 infections and hospitalizations in Johnson County, the state of Iowa and the nation continue to decrease; and

WHEREAS, the Johnson County population is 48% vaccinated as of May 15, 2021, and vaccines are available to all Johnson County residents age 12 and above; and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has determined that face coverings are not needed outdoors and in most indoor settings for individuals that are fully vaccinated except for health care facilities, airline travel, public transport, congregate settings, homeless shelters, prisons and jails; and

WHEREAS, the Johnson County Board of Health enacted a regulation rescinding the face covering regulation on May 26, 2021, and has submitted such regulation to the Johnson County Board of Supervisors for approval pursuant to Iowa Code 137.104(1)(b)(2); now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOVOLVED, the Johnson County Board of Supervisors approves the following Johnson County Public Health regulation to rescind the mandate for wearing of face coverings in public places:

## JOHNSON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH REGULATION RESCINDING FACE COVERING REGULATION

## Section I

#### **Authority and Applicability**

1.01 Iowa Code 137.104 provides that, "a local board of health shall...make and enforce such reasonable rules and regulations not inconsistent with law and the rules of the state board as may be necessary for the protection and improvement of the public health."

1.02 The Johnson County Board of Health finds that given the current conditions in Johnson County and recent recommendations by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, a regulation mandating the wearing of face coverings by all persons in public places in Johnson County is no longer warranted.

#### Section II Definitions

2.01 "ADMINISTRATIVE AUTHORITY" means the local board of health as authorized by Iowa Code Chapter 137, or its appointed representative.

2.02 "THE BOARD" means the Johnson County Board of Health

2.03 "THE COUNTY" means Johnson County, Iowa

2.04 "FACE COVERING" means a material that securely covers a person's nose and mouth and remains affixed in place without the use of one's hands, whether purchased or homemade, and consistent with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines

#### Section III Regulation

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, pursuant to Iowa Code 137.104, be it hereby ordered and enforced by the Board as the Administrative Authority, as follows:

The Face Covering Regulation enacted on August 10, 2020 is hereby rescinded in its entirety. Rescinding this regulation shall not affect the ability of businesses or other private entities to require members of the public to wear face coverings while on the premises.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, upon an affirmative vote of the Board of Health to enact the above regulation, the Director of Johnson County Public Health shall present the above regulation to the Board of Supervisors for its approval pursuant to Iowa Code §137.104(1)(b)(2).

## RESOLUTION NO. \_ O 6 - 24 - 21 - 0 \( \) RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING LULU MERLE JOHNSON AS THE OFFICIAL EPONYM OF JOHNSON COUNTY, IOWA

Whereas, the people of Johnson County acknowledge that names carry power and believe the county eponym should be a person who both embodies their sense of values, ideals, and morals, and has a personal connection to Johnson County and the State of Iowa; and

Whereas, the County of Johnson in the State of Iowa was originally named after Richard Mentor Johnson, a lifelong Kentuckian with no known personal connections to either Johnson County or the State of Iowa, by the Wisconsin Territorial Legislature in 1837; and

Whereas, Richard Mentor Johnson took credit for killing the legendary Shawnee Chief Tecumseh at the Battle of the Thames in 1805, and then later in his life used this fact for his political gain; and

Whereas, Richard Mentor Johnson was a lifelong slave owner who was known for using his position as such to engage in coercive relationships with his slaves; and

Whereas, Richard Mentor Johnson does not embody the values, ideals, and morals of the people of Johnson County; and

Whereas, the Johnson County Board of Supervisors is committed to rectifying systemic racism and institutional inequity, including removing names and monuments that memorialize or honor a person who has perpetuated violence against Black people, Indigenous people, and other nonwhite people, or a cause that is manifestly unjust; and

Whereas, the people of Johnson County believe that the institution of slavery was and is a grave injustice against humanity; and

Whereas, the people of Johnson County wholeheartedly believe that, as is reflected in the Iowa Constitution, all persons are "by nature, free and equal," and that all persons have the inalienable right to enjoy their liberty and pursue their happiness; and

Whereas, it is the aim of the Johnson County Board of Supervisors to educate its residents through the recognition of esteemed state and local heroes, places, and concepts that uphold the honorable ideals of liberty, democracy, and self-determination; and

Whereas, Lulu Merle Johnson was born in 1907 in the City of Gravity, State of Iowa, to parents who were born into slavery; and

Whereas, Lulu Merle Johnson entered the State University of Iowa in 1925, at a time when she was 1 of only 14 African-American women enrolled at the university; and

Whereas, Lulu Merle Johnson, despite facing open discrimination based on her status as an African-American woman, completed both bachelor's and master's degrees by 1930; and

Whereas, Lulu Merle Johnson, in 1931, while also maintaining a career as a professor, began studies toward her Doctor of Philosophy degree at the State University of Iowa, and, in 1941, became the first African-American woman to earn a Ph.D. from that institution; and

Whereas, Dr. Lulu Merle Johnson, from 1931 until her retirement in 1971, maintained an active career as an academic and college professor, teaching history at Historically Black Colleges and Universities, and rising through the ranks to become the Dean of Women at Cheyney State University; and

Whereas, Dr. Lulu Merle Johnson is recognized by the University of Iowa Graduate College for her role as a trailblazing academic through its establishment of the Lulu Merle Johnson Recruitment Fellowship to recruit talented doctoral students from underrepresented minority groups; and

Whereas, Dr. Lulu Merle Johnson, a vibrant person and accomplished academic with strong connections to the State of Iowa and Johnson County, through her determination to succeed despite discrimination and adversity, embodied the values, ideals, and morals which the people of Johnson County strive to preserve and uphold.

Now, Therefore, be it resolved that we, the Board of Supervisors of Johnson County, Iowa, shall henceforth recognize as its official eponym Dr. Lulu Merle Johnson, an inspirational woman whose story of accomplishment in the face of adversity is one of which the citizens of Johnson County can be proud for generations to come.
