

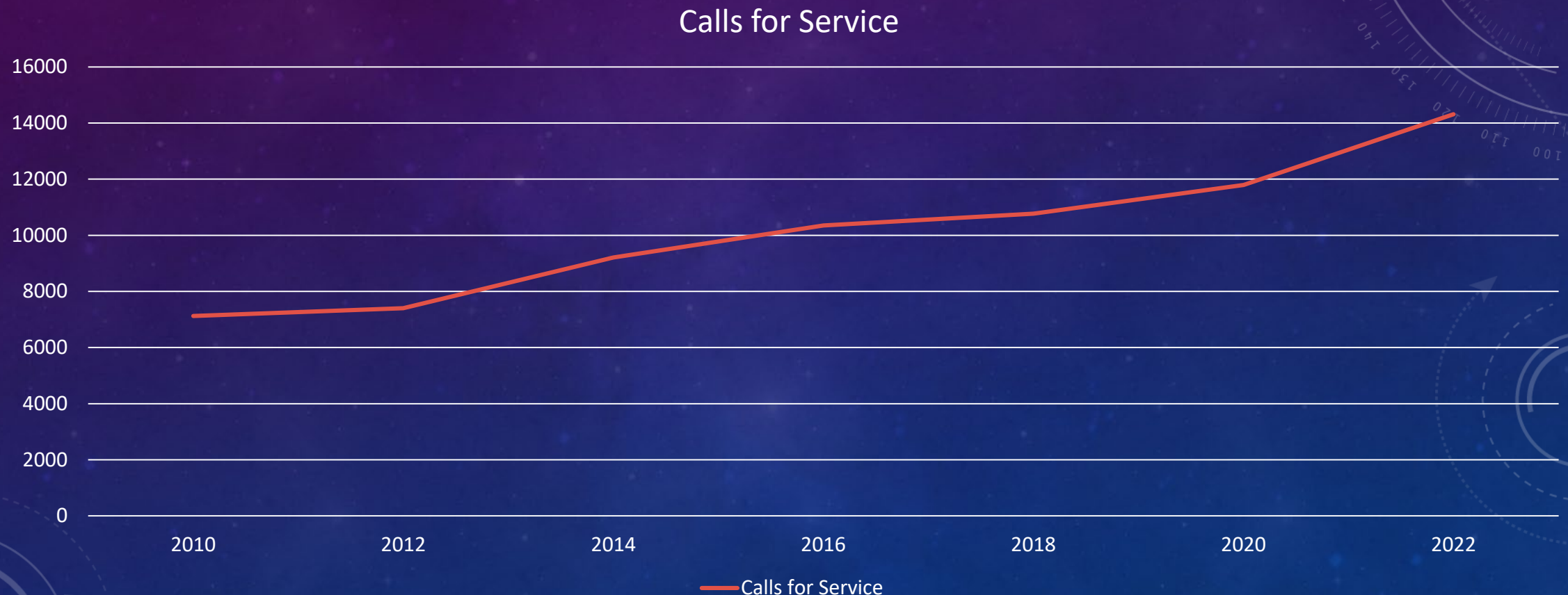

OPERATIONAL/SERVICE UPDATES

- Creation and implementation of Field Training Officer Program at JCAS
- Credit for previous EMS experience available for new hires as applicable
- New EMS work schedule consisting of primarily 8 and 16 hour shifts
- Enhanced training program at JCAS to include PHTLS and AMLS
- Increased staffing:
 - 4 ambulances 24 hours/7 days
 - 5 ambulances 16 hours/7 days
 - 6 ambulances 8 hours / 7 days

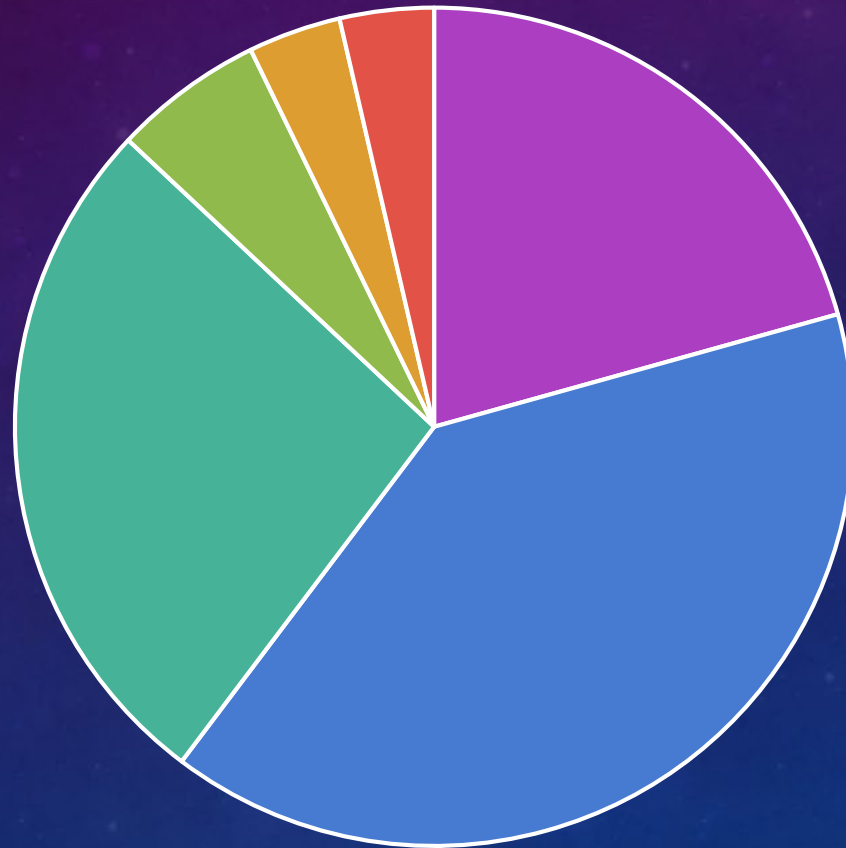

COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION OF AMBULANCE SERVICES (CAAS)

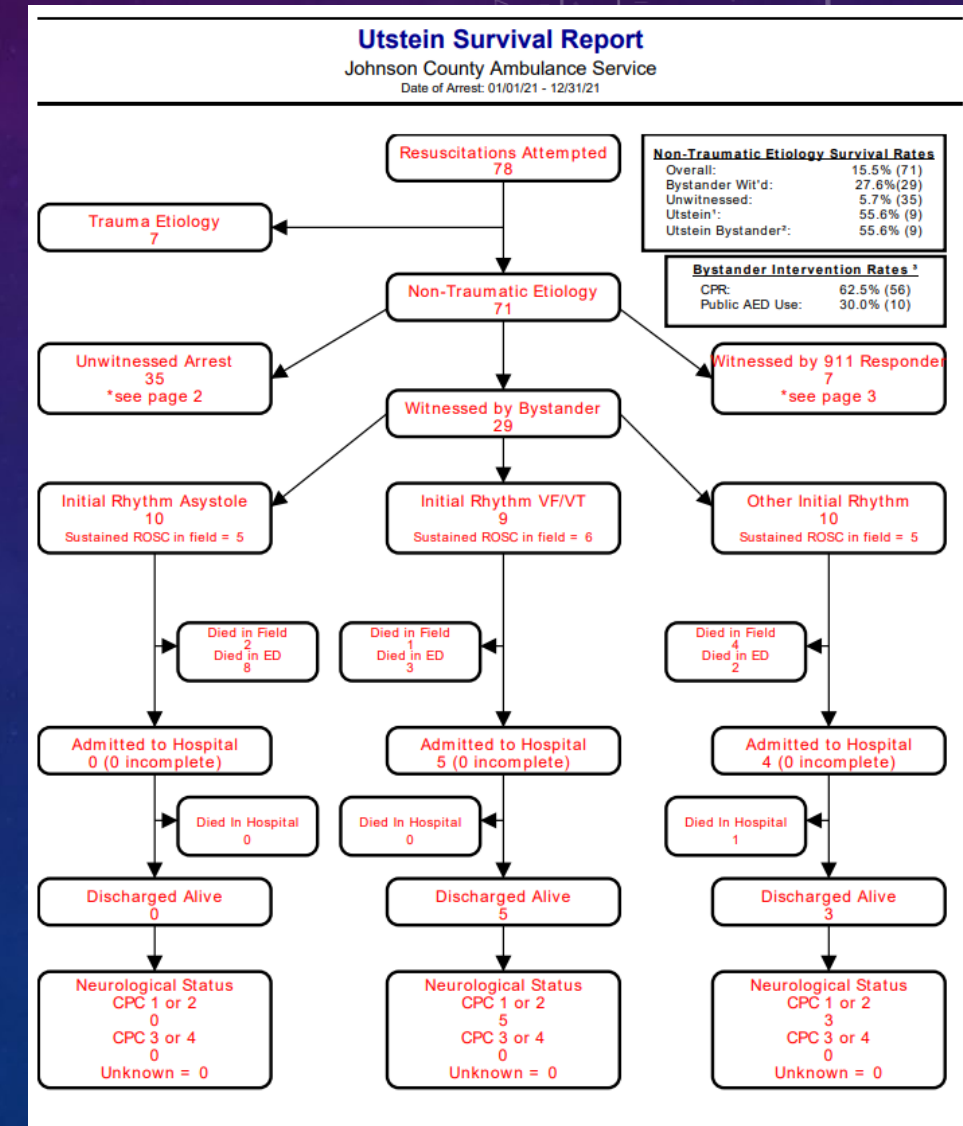
- JCAS has met the “gold standard” of the Commission on Accreditation of Ambulance Services
- JCAS the 4th ambulance service in the state of Iowa to be accredited



CARDIAC REGISTRY TO ENHANCE SURVIVAL STATISTICS

JCAS has a higher than national average for sudden cardiac arrest survival:

- Survival to discharge 15.5% vs 9.1%
- Survival with good/moderate neurologic outcome 15.5% vs 7.2%



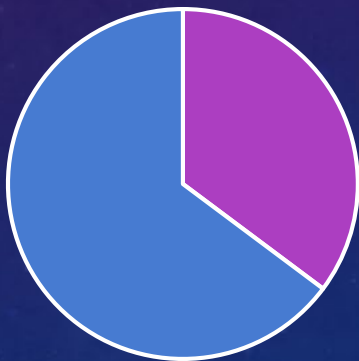
CARDIAC ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

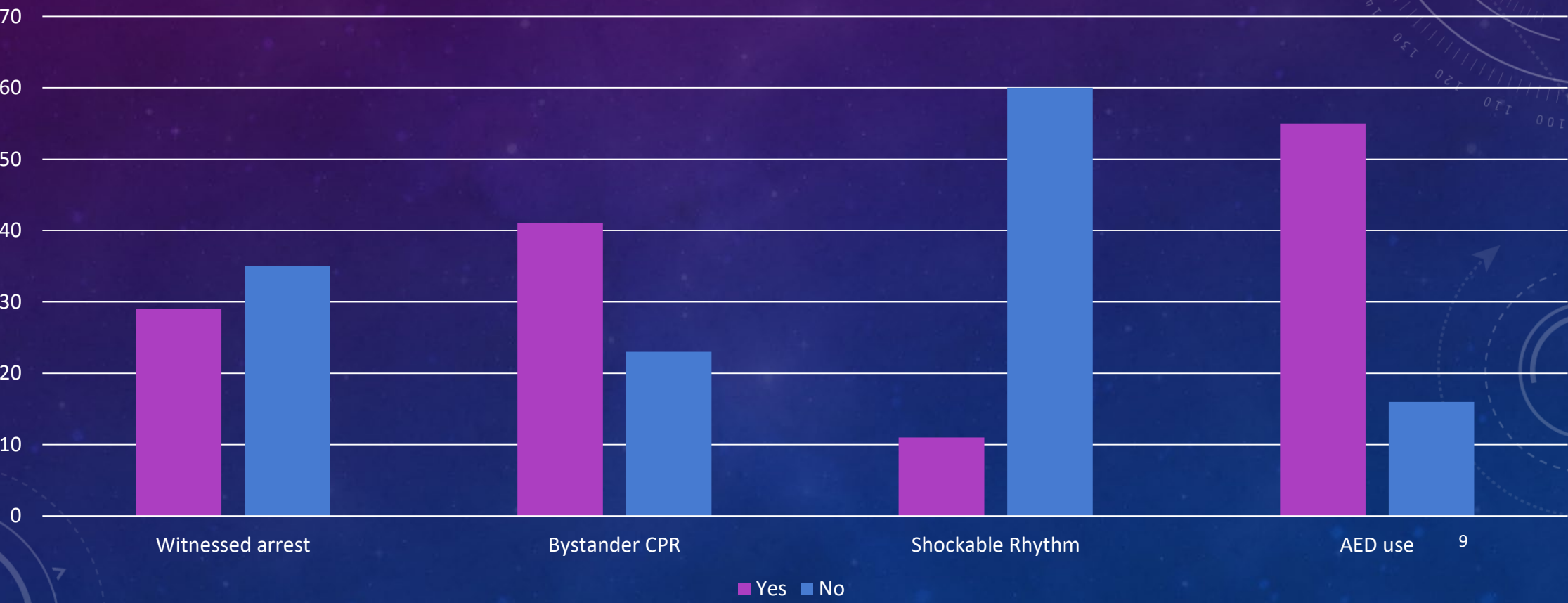

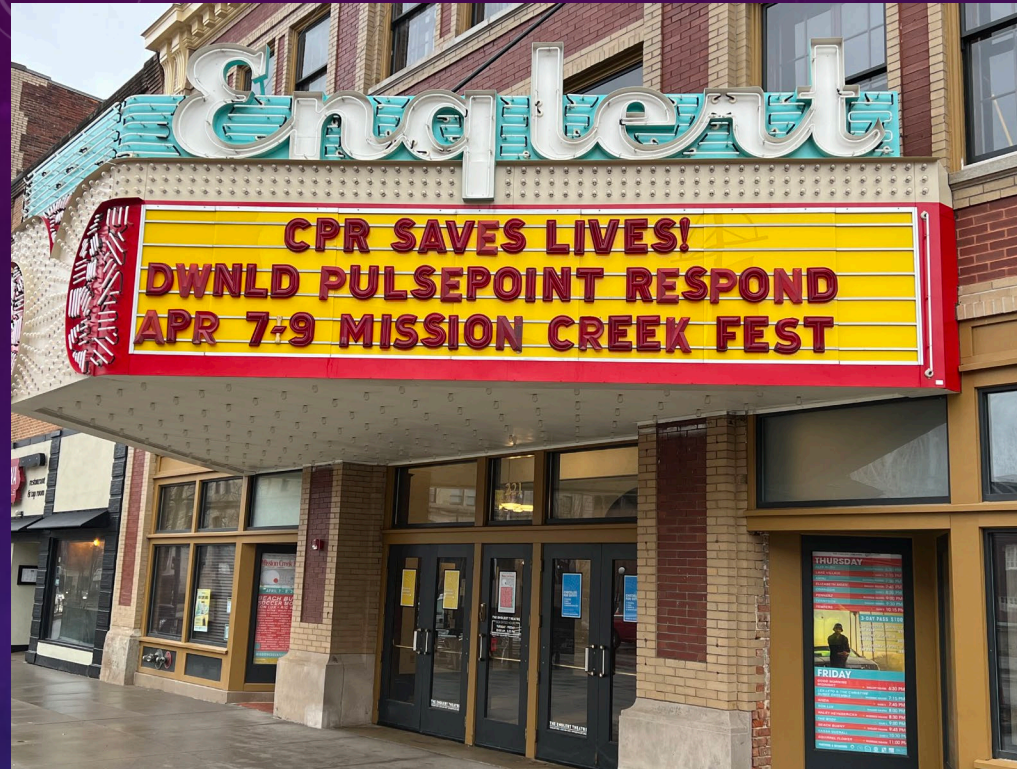

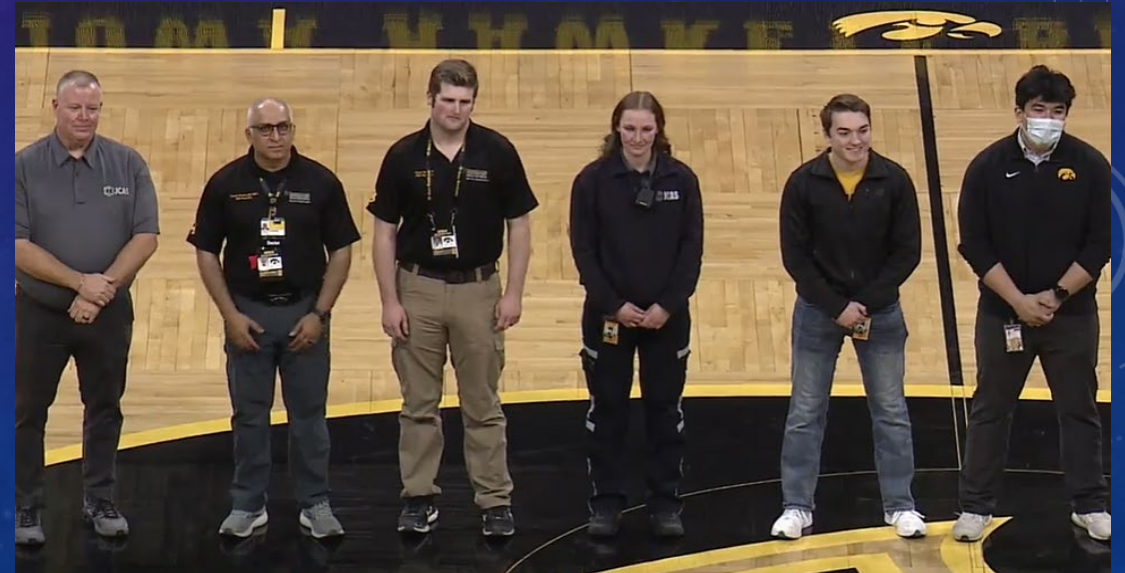
- Launched 2/14/22

CONTINUED LIFESAVING EFFORTS

- 20 AEDs dispersed in Johnson County in 2022 with the help of the Rotary Kerber Heart Safe Community Campaign and local communities
- Goal to dispense 20 additional AEDs, stop the bleed kits and Narcan into enclosures (new and pre-existing) in 2023
- Partnership with local libraries (IC/NL/CV) for training and CPR mannequins available for check out & other community collaboration

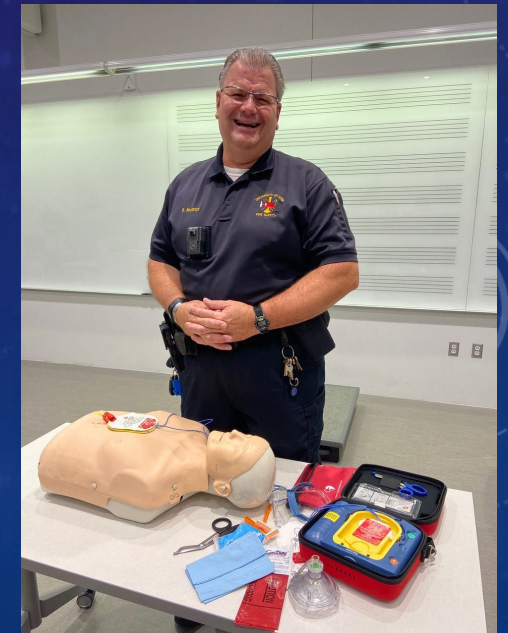

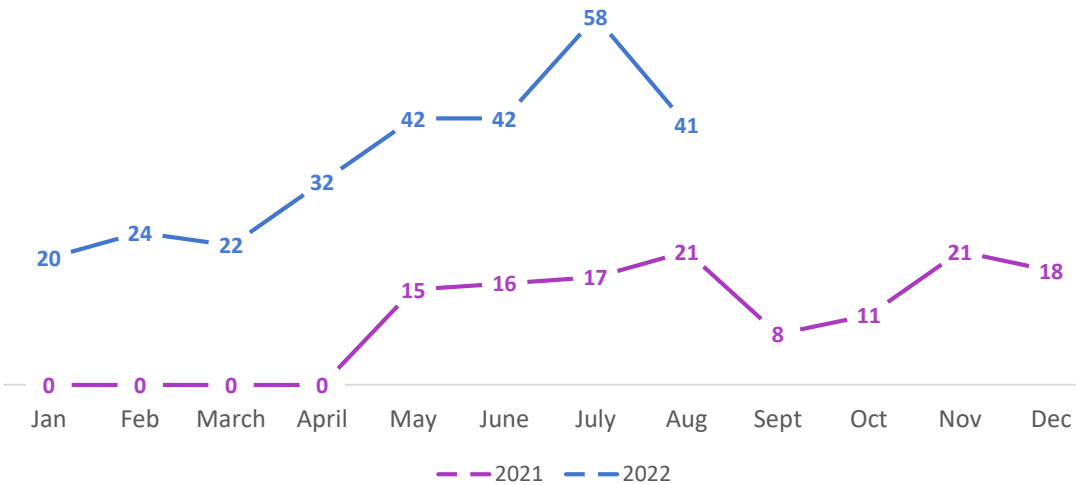

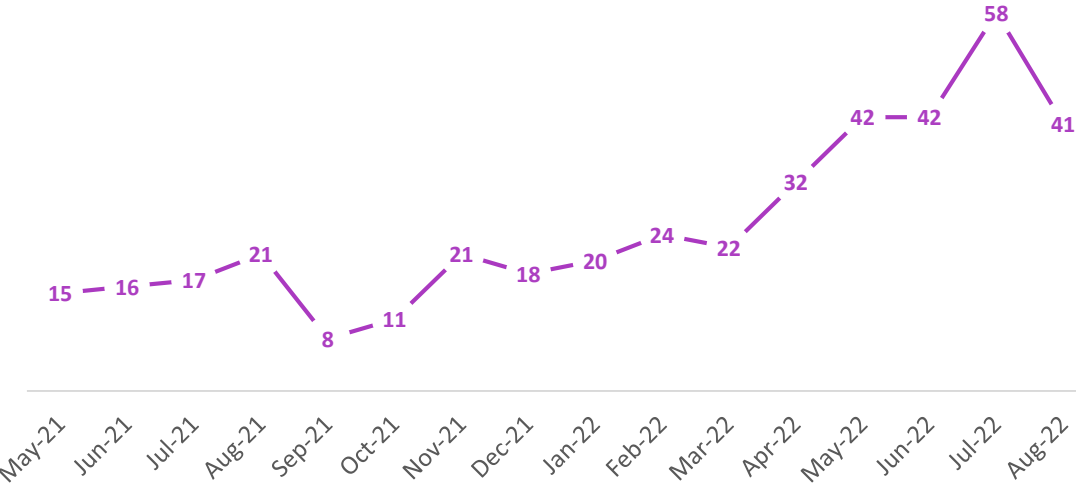

- AED registry, public awareness and encouragement of bystander intervention
- Effective emergency response plans in schools
- 911 Dispatch assisted CPR instructions
