Mental Health Resources

We all know the holidays are supposed to be a joyous and happy time full of celebrations with family and friends. But for many people the holiday season often comes with a few unwelcome guests – anxiety, stress, loneliness, family quarrels, and even depression.

Below are tremendous resources available year round to help.





Iowa Warm Line

The Iowa Warm Line is a peer-run, telephone based, non-crisis and confidential listening line for anyone struggling with mental health or substance use issues. The Warm Line is staffed by individuals who have been through a similar journey and are in recovery themselves. The phone number to call is 1-844-775-WARM (9276).

The Warm Line can...

• Give support for individuals not requiring crisis management. Those in crisis are transferred to the Crisis Line for critical services.

- Provide empathetic, non-judgmental listening.
- Provide referrals to specialty resources and assistance in accessing services.
- Empower individuals to pursue health and well-being.

Disaster Distress Helpline: 1-800-985-5990

The Disaster Distress Helpline is a 24/7, 365-day-a-year, national hotline dedicated to providing immediate crisis counseling for people who are experiencing emotional distress related to any natural or human caused disaster.

Crisis Helpline Services Phone/ Chat/ Text: 988

In anticipation of national helpline changes, CommUnity's Crisis Intervention Program has shifted its name to Crisis Helpline Services. This shift in language better represents the work of our counselors and the future of our organization. Though the program name and internal titles have changed slightly, our services remain unchanged. We are always available via phone, chat, or text to support clients through an emotional crisis.

Who should call?

Anyone. People call us if they're having thoughts of suicide, worried about a friend or family member, reeling from a recent break up or disappointment, and many other reasons. No problem is too big, and certainly none is too small. If you're thinking about talking to us, we want you to reach out.

What can I expect?

Phone: Call 988 and you'll be connected to a trained crisis counselor near you. They will listen, help you explore your feelings, work with you to create a safety plan if you think it would be helpful, and connect you with resources as needed.

Chat: Go to <u>988lifeline.org/chat</u> and click "Chat Now." You will fill out a survey that helps us learn more about you and how you're feeling. You will be connected with a trained crisis counselor in a private chat where they will listen, help you explore your feelings, work with you to create a safety plan if you think it would be helpful, and connect you with resources as needed. After you've completed the chat session, there is a follow-up survey that gives us important data to measure our counselors' effectiveness.

Text: Text anything to 988. A trained crisis counselor will text you back and listen, help you explore your feelings, work with you to create a safety plan if you think it would be helpful, and connect you with resources as needed.

NAMI, the acronym for the National Alliance on Mental Illness, is the nation's leading grassroots, self help, education, support and advocacy organization dedicated to improving the lives of individuals and families affected by mental illness.

<u>-UnityPoint Health - AbbeHealth Services</u> is a regional nonprofit organization dedicated to providing mental health and aging services that help individuals achieve their optimum levels of independence and success.

<u>-Community & Family Resources</u> has merged with Prelude Behavioral Services and offers prevention services, substance abuse and addiction treatment, drug testing, family services, and more.

- <u>Contact the Caregiver Support Program at Heritage AAA</u> to learn about resources and respite to support your caregiving



Iowa Homeowner Assistance Fund



MORTGAGE HELP IS HERE FOR IOWA HOMEOWNERS

The Iowa Homeowner Assistance Fund program assists eligible Iowa homeowners in avoiding foreclosure by providing financial assistance with mortgage payments and related property expenses.

AM I ELIGIBLE?

ELIGIBLE HOMEOWNERS MUST:

- Be income qualified
- · Have had someone in the household experience a financial hardship after January 21, 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - This could be the result of a reduction in income or increase in living expenses due to job loss, fewer work hours, paying more for childcare, illness, or being unable to work because you had to take care of a family member
- Be at least one payment behind on one of the following:
- Mortgage
- Contract sale, (purchasing a home under a legally recorded contract)
- Manufactured home
- Property taxes.
- · Own the property located in Iowa (applicants purchasing a home under a legally recorded contract are eligible)
- · Occupy the home as their primary residence

WHAT TYPE OF ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE?

Up to \$25,000 per eligible household to assist with past due payments, including:

Eligible Past Due Expenses:



- Mortgage Payments
- · Land contract sale payments
- Manufactured Home/Lot Rent Payments
- Property Taxes

IOWA FINANCE

- Homeowner's Insurance (Homeowner's hazard, flood, and/or mortgage insurance)
- Homeowner Association Fees

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO TO APPLY?

- STEP Take the eligibility precheck at iowafinance.com/IHAE to determine 1 preliminary eligibility.
- STEP Prepare required application 2 documentation.
- STEP Submit online application at iowafinance.com/IHAE 3

- STEP The mortgage servicer and/or other service providers of past due amounts will be required to verify the information submitted by the applicant.
 - The case review team will review the application to ensure all documentation is complete and to verify eligibility.

In some cases, applicants will be referred to free, confidential mortgage counseling through Iowa Mortgage Help to ensure housing stability prior to being eligible for financial assistance through the program.

WILL I RECEIVE PAYMENT DIRECTLY, IF APPROVED?

No. Payments will be made directly to mortgage servicers and other payees, as applicable to be applied to the homeowner's account(s).
