New Iowa Homestead Exemption for Owners 65 years of age and older



On May 4, 2023, Governor Reynolds signed <u>House File 718</u>, establishing a homestead tax exemption for claimants 65 years of age or older.

In addition to the homestead tax credit, eligible claimants who own the home they live in and are 65 years of age or older on or before January 1 of the assessment year are now eligible for a homestead tax exemption. For the assessment year beginning on January 1, 2023, the exemption is for \$3,250 of taxable value. For assessment years beginning on or after January 1, 2024, the exemption is for \$6,500 of taxable value. An exemption is a reduction in the taxable value of the property rather than a direct reduction in the amount of property tax you pay.

Please come to our office at 913 S Dubuque St, Iowa City, to apply for the new exemption. Applications are due July 1. If the exemption is granted, the exemption will be allowed for future years without future filing as long as the claimant continues to qualify.

TRAIL hosts June 15 Johnson County Senior Fair

TRAIL of Johnson County, the local aging-in-place nonprofit, is hosting a Senior Housing and Services Fair on Thursday, June 15, 2023, from 11:30 AM to 1:30 PM at the Kirkwood Regional Center, 2301 Oakdale Blvd., in Coralville. The event is free and open to the public.

According to TRAIL Executive Director Bob Untiedt, the fair is in response to the growth in senior housing options in Johnson County, as well as the increased need for at-home services, including medical and non-medical care.

"TRAIL members, their friends and families are curious about these new senior living communities and their amenities," Untiedt says. "This event allows attendees to sample the features of many local facilities all in one place. Fair visitors also will learn more about the many at-home service agencies, including TRAIL, that help older adults continue living in their own homes as they age."

Fair attendees also will be able to take home a free copy of TRAIL's new<u>2023</u> <u>Johnson County Senior Housing and Services Guide</u> (while supplies last), a 60-page booklet that includes descriptions of more than 30 senior living facilities (independent living, assisted living, memory care, and skilled nursing), 17 at-home medical and non-medical care providers and more.

Senior Farmer's Market Nutrition Program

The Senior Farmer's Market Nutrition Program is sponsored through the US Department of Agriculture and administered through the Heritage Area Agency on Aging.

Qualified seniors will receive \$50 worth of checks to use at participating area farmers' markets vendors per year.

The 12th annual Johnson County lowa Juneteenth Commemoration events will be held June 9th- June 20th, 2023. All events are free and open to the public.

A Juneteenth concert and celebration for the entire county will take place in Downtown Iowa City during the evening of June 16, 2023.

The event will feature a wide assortment of attractions for all ages: 4 pm A resource fair at Blackhawk Mini Park



5 pm Free soul food provided while supplies last 5:30 pm A fashion show on the Pedestrian Mall main stage 6:30 pm Live music from Isaac Jordan on the main stage of the 8 pm Live music from Aniba and the Sol Starz on the main stage

Other attractions include the Iowa City Public Library's Bookmobile, activities provided by the North Liberty Public Library, and more!

Isaac Jordan, who performed at last year's lowa City Pride celebration, will kick off the evening's music at 6:30 p.m. Next up, Chicago's favorite soul band Aniba and the Sol Starz will headline the concert beginning at 9 pm.

This year's Juneteenth celebration is a collaboration between many community organizations: Johnson County Government, Think Iowa City, the City of Iowa City, the Summer of the Arts, Iowa City Pride, Neighborhood Centers of Johnson County, Dream City, the Iowa City Downtown District, the Wright School of Fashion, the Community Foundation of Johnson County, Royceann's Soul Food, and the Black Voices Project.

Juneteenth commemorates the end of slavery in the United States. On June 19, 1865, two-and-a-half years after the Emancipation Proclamation, Union soldiers sailed into Galveston, Texas, and read aloud the order, freeing a quarter of a million slaves who were residing in the state.


