Responses to questions received via email prior to the issuance of this addendum are as follows:

QUESTION:

What fee budget has the County allocated for the space needs assessment?

RESPONSE:

The County currently has \$75,000 budgeted for the assessment in the FY24 budget.

QUESTION:

Can you clarify what you are looking for from 2D regarding Agency's objectives in relation to this project.

RESPONSE:

Like it says in the RFQ, we're looking for a global assessment of the Sheriff's Office space needs to determine what needs we currently have and what a new facility would need to meet the demand of today as well as the future. The assessment needs to cover all aspects of what we do: jail and jail bed space, patrol, civil, investigations, etc.

QUESTION:

To confirm as I'm still a bit unclear, for the RFQ question 2D regarding Agency's objectives in relation to this project – are you looking for Legat to acknowledge and confirm our understanding of your project?

RESPONSE:

Yes that would be helpful.

QUESTION:

- 1. Have JCSO facility/building system assessments been completed in past 10 years? If so, can these be made available?
- 2. Are any building assessments currently or within the past 2 years underway to examine systems or structure?
- Johnson County has had previous jail bond referendums. Please provide dates and results from these past efforts.



- 4. In these past jail bond referendum efforts, were outside community engagement consultants hired?
- 5. Why have past Johnson County jail bond referendum efforts failed to gain voter approval?
- 6. RFQ document specifically states "3 assignments of similar projects and budget ranges that were completed". If a respondent provides more than 3 assignments, will providing additional examples penalize/disqualify that firm?

RESPONSE:

- 1. A county wide facility audit was completed within the last year and a structural assessment was completed in April. Both reports can be made available.
- 2. See answer to Question 1.
- 3. June 1976: Similar justice center concept to 2014 design
 - Failed 49% yes 51% no

March 1977: 6.5 Million for courthouse improvements

• Failed 40% yes – 60% no

November 1977: 1.5 million for a new jail

Passed: 75% yes – 25% no

November 2000: 20.3 million for County Law Enforcement Center

• Failed 35% yes – 65% no

November 2012: 46.8 million for Justice Center/court operations

• Failed 56% yes- 44% no (60% threshold for approval)

May 2013: 43.5 million Justice Center/court operations (less bed space)

- Failed yes 54% 46% no (60% threshold for approval)
- 4. Unknown. Past referendums occurred under previous administrations.
- 5. That answer would be very nuanced and subjective.
- 6. No, a respondent can submit more than three assignments.
