

In Case You Missed It The Great Iowa Treasure Hunt had great success returning funds to past and present Iowans on National Unclaimed Property Day, celebrated annually on February 1. From January 29 to February 6, the Great Iowa Treasure Hunt had over 10,000 claims submitted totaling over \$4 million! This year's largest claim was for over \$400,000! Over 415,000 properties for past and present Iowans were added to our list in 2022, so even if you've searched for your name before, it could be beneficial to search again at GreatIowaTreasureHunt.gov. You never know what might be waiting for you!

Iowa Rent Reimbursement

If you're a low-income Iowan aged 65 or older or a low-income disabled adult you may be eligible for a partial reimbursement of your rent. You can now apply for reimbursement for 2024 and 2023 claims using any device that connects to the internet. To be eligible you need to be 65 or older in the claim year or be at least 18 and totally disabled in the claim year.

Income Limits

To be eligible for Rent Reimbursement for claim year 2024, your total annual household income must be less than \$26,219

To be eligible for Rent Reimbursement for claim year 2023, your total annual household income must be less than \$25,328

Hazardous Material Collection Facility

Improper disposal of batteries in the regular garbage is a leading cause of landfill fires. Prevent landfill fires and the release of hazardous chemicals in the local environment by properly recycling batteries at several local drop-off locations listed below.

Damaged batteries, large lead-acid batteries, and large quantities of batteries should be taken directly to the Hazardous Material Collection Facility.

Battery terminals must be taped with clear packing tape (do not use any other type of tape) or placed in a sealed, clear plastic bag (one battery per bag). Residents are encouraged to tape or bag, however, if batteries are not taped or bagged when they arrive at drop-off locations,

Fighting Against Fraud

This course is to increase awareness of phone and internet fraud. Scammers are professionals who target all ages. Tips on how to recognize that the person on the other end of a conversation is intimidating you, promising false hopes of employment, or threatening you with legal claims, can help avoid financial loss as well as emotional trauma. All of us can be caught off guard by an email or phone call that requires immediate attention or something horrible will happen if we don't comply. Your brain goes into reactive mode and you do what you are told without stepping back and thinking through the situation. This course will provide tools for you to keep yourself and financial information safe and not in the hands of scammers.
